With its second Annual Seminar, Institut du Bosphore confirms its role of a key actor in French-Turkish relations.

After the success of its first Annual Seminar on October 2009, the second seminar of Institut du Bosphore will take place in Istanbul, Swissotel on 11 and 12 June. A think tank with a notable French-Turkish Scientific Committee, Institut du Bosphore was created in 2009 as a TUSIAD initiative, the association of industrialists and businessmen of Turkey. In a context which Turkey plays a key role in global balances, Institut du Bosphore intends to be one of the active drivers of innovative debate over the relations between Turkey and the EU in general and France in particular. The debates in the second seminar of the Institute will be focusing on the following theme :
